



















Excerpt from the introduction of *Opening Doors to a New World:*

As I sit by my window, overlooking our small, beautiful garden, I wonder why I ever started to write a book about God in this secular age. Was it madness? Time will tell.

It all began with an earlier book, *O My God! Where Are You?* (the second edition is called *Dear Theophilus*). Originally written for an atheist son-in-law, Frank, who asked quite sincerely one day, after "dutifully" attending a church service with the family, "Nancy, do you really believe in all this?" Later he picked up a Bible, groaning in despair, "And where do you begin with all this stuff?"

Dear Theophilus and Opening Doors to a New World look for those answers.

The author's two books are a prayer – a plea – to all Christian leaders to embrace a younger generation in the community marketplace, and to reach out to members of other faiths, agnostics, and atheists, encompassing one human family unconditionally. Although the voices of young people have barely been heard in most traditional churches for years, an exciting groundswell of young believers, like tiny pockets of seedlings, are growing to bring the love of God home again in a way the young can relate.

Finding a faith is a positive step to a life of hope, and discovering a secret, invisible, beautiful garden with a small gate called Love, through which to enter.

Opening Doors, a contemporary version of the Book of Acts, offers ideas to cross generational and interfaith bridges. The book becomes a valuable resource offering a wealth of historical information, challenging questions to stimulate discussion, a summary of important Christian events, a diagram of creation, and a brief look at 12 major religions.
